LANGUAGE

A child's ability to speak increases as they grow up. A school age child typically produces phrases that are 1-6 words long or greater.

Your child is currently at the two word level. We are going to work on increasing how many words he says, how he describes, and how long his phrases are.

SPEECH

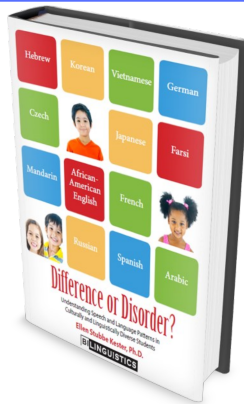
A child's ability to speak increases as they grow up. We typically understand 100% of what a child says over age 4.

Your child can currently be understood when he produces two words. However, when he produces short phrases his is more difficult to understand. We are going to work on increasing how well he is understood when he speaks in short phrases and at the sentence level.

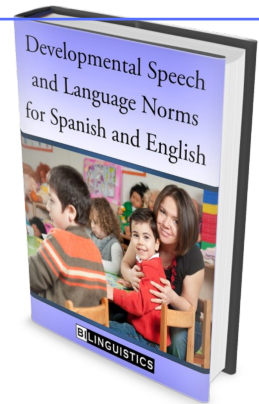
